



Europe's Migrant Problem and Ours

Christopher Caldwell is a senior editor at the *Weekly Standard* and the author of <u>Reflections on the Revolution in Europe</u> (Doubleday/Penguin), a work that has been translated into several European languages. His essays, columns and reviews appear in the *Wall Street Journal*, the *Financial Times*, the *Claremont Review of Books*, the *New York Times Book Review* and other publications. He has written extensively on immigration, European politics, and contemporary intellectual life. A graduate of Harvard University, he is presently at work on a book about post-1960s America.

Brian C. Anderson is the editor of *City Journal*, the cultural and political quarterly published by the Manhattan Institute, where he writes on social and political trends. the Political (2005), and co-author of A Manifesto for Media Freedom (2008). He is also the editor of The Beholden State (2013). Anderson holds a Ph.D. in political philosophy from the University of Ottawa and an M.A. and a B.A. from Boston College.
