Panels will be offered on Friday, April 19, and Saturday, April 20; a pre-conference welcome event will be held on the evening of Thursday, April 19.

Accepted proposals will present on panels dedicated to undergraduate research; presenters must be accompanied at the conference by a sponsoring faculty member.
